2. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$200 for Bayou St. Vincent Debris Removal Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,762 for 154-158 Ewell St. Culvert Installation Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Vice-Chairman Chris Carter recognized committee member Myron Matherne, who stated that there is a break in the Northwest Side of LA 70 Drainage District Levee that occurred during the high water. He then requested that it be repaired. In response, the Vice-Chairman stated that the cost for the project is \$804.
5. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$804 for Northwest Side of LA 70 Drainage District Levee Repair Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Drainage Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Finance Committee Meeting  
Of the

1. Members recorded as present were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Acting Chairman, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Booster Breaux.  
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, THAT, the committee approve the 'List of Bills' dated October 4, 2019." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Vice-Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that renewal contract with Script Care is similar to the contract the Parish had for the employees. She stated that the renewal with Script Care is for the Detention Center. She stated that we are under an existing contract with them dating back 12 yrs. After speaking with the representative, they agreed to do a renewal agreement that has been reviewed by the ADA. The costs are more in favor of the Parish. She then stated that the Parish currently uses Assumption Pharmacy for filling the script and she has spoken with the Pharmacist regarding the new rates that are being charged and she is ok with them. Therefore, she recommends that this 3 yr. contract renewal be approved and accepted. She also mentioned that the Parish has an option to term out of the contract at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> year with proper notification.
4. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the updated renewal contract with Script Care for the Detention Center." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Vice-Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that she's presenting the information for the members to deliberate, ask questions and consider. She stated that being realistic, if the level of spending continues at the current rate, the general fund budget will be at \$0 in 3 yrs. This is a problem therefore, the spending can't continue on the same path. She stated that she has been through the General Fund budget and chose some options for consideration. Some will agree and some will not agree, it will impact other agencies and potential individuals. She further stated that she is sensitive to the political arena that we are in however, it is our due diligence to make sure the Parish has money to continue operating. She proceeded to propose some budget reductions and changes that should be considered for the upcoming 2020 budget. The Secretary-Treasurer then explained the salary distribution current, proposed and estimated savings. She explained that hourly employees can disburse their hours in accordance with the department in which they work but salaried employees cannot. Therefore, she explained her proposal and shared how it would assist the General Fund budget in savings of \$101,482.16 plus associated benefit re-allocations. She then pointed out that the budget cuts that are listed is what she feels are potentials to be cut which may not be easy or even agreed upon.
6. Police Juror Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
7. The Secretary-Treasurer proceeded to review that list but explained in detail how the move with the Veterans Office can be beneficial. She stated that the yearly savings in this area is \$206,515 bringing the yearly savings total for salaries and budgets cuts to \$307,997.16. She then stated that the additional allocations for consideration are as follows. She stated that she spoke with the OHSEP Director as well as the President regarding the Special Industry Fund. She stated that the Special Industry Fund was put in place for emergency response etc. therefore, \$50,000 should be transferred annually to OEP to help subsidize the salaries. She then stated that she feels the need to speak with the District Attorney and the Chief Judge regarding an increase in fines and forfeitures within the Criminal Court. There is no figure in how much it would generate. She added that the legislative has allowed for parishes to implement a RV tax and this board needs to decide when and if they will implement it. She stated that backlash was received by a few because the park owners thought the cost was too high but the neighboring parishes assess a 2% charge. She proceeded to say that based on the RV Parks in the parish we could generate approximately \$100,000 a year for General Fund to assist with payment of the prisoner fees that we have no control over. A proposal of a \$2 increase per household in sewer fees was suggested and It would generate about \$9,528. She stated that the parish usually transfers \$15,000 to \$25,000 to the sewer district. She added that she and the Parish Manager spoke about the aged districts and the expectation of the repair cost. In response, Police Juror Chris Carter stated that a system needs to be devised on who will track the sewer connections. He stated that there are connections that are not paying the fee and the Waterworks thinks the Parish is tracking and the Parish is expecting the Waterworks to track therefore, we need to come up with a method.

The Secretary-Treasurer then proposed a reduction in the Juror light allocation. In response, Police Juror Irving Comeaux stated the intentions of the Jury when placing those lights but commented that some of the placements didn't follow standards. He further stated that none of the sitting Jurors wants to see budget cuts but it's our responsibility to make sure the Parish is run as economical as possible. The Secretary-Treasurer then stated that her final consideration is the discontinuation of recreation allocation carryovers leaving each ward with a minimum of \$5,000 for 2020 not inclusive of the \$5,000 additional allocation. The savings would be \$270,261. A brief discussion was held regarding the reason for the accumulation and the benefits of passing a millage. In response, Police Juror Chris Carter stated that he and the Grants Coordinator looked into a millage for Ward 6 and determined that it would not be nearly what is collected in Wards 3 and 8. The Secretary-Treasurer stated that she is not saying recreation would not be supported but the project would be presented to the board and they would decide if it gets prioritized as a parish project. She further stated that this is a proposal for the consideration of the Jury however, she will need some answers within the next two weeks to prepare the 2020 budget.

A brief discussion was held regarding the need for a special finance committee meeting before the next regular meeting.

8. Acting Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized Don Breaux, Pierre Part Fire Chief and Don Blanchard, Napoleonville Fire Chief. Don Breaux commended the Secretary-Treasurer for her budget cut suggestions and agrees with the discussion by the Police Jury. He stated that they also agree with the hydrant cut and believes it is the Waterworks responsibility. He then stated that they have concerns with the radio system and was under the impression that the radio maintenance and operation were under the 911/OEP budget. He stated that this cost has never been deducted from their budget. He then asked who owns the radios and who should maintain them and stated that over the years someone has. He then stated that recently the Fire Departments assisted the Sheriff's Office with installing the new console. He added that the back up radio system was in deplorable condition and fire departments came together and funded a new backup radio system that PIL requires them to have. He further stated that the radios should not be their responsibility because they don't own them. In response, the Secretary-Treasurer stated that that discussion was held and it will be a part of the discussion at the special finance committee meeting that the Parish will hold. She added that it's difficult to say because grant funding is received and an act of donation is sometimes received therefore, the determination needs to be made. Fire Chief Don Blanchard stated that for decades it was assumed that the Police Jury owns the fire department radios. Following a brief discussion, the committee stated that the matter will be further discussed and a decision will be reached.
9. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Finance Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Road & Bridge Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Ron Alcorn, Chairman; Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne  
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Juror recorded as present was: Mr. Irving Comeaux.
2. Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that the Parish has been going back and forth with Coastal Bridge relative to completing the 2018 Road Overlay Program. He stated that in his opinion they have not shown the willingness to come in and complete the items. He then recommended that prior to the next meeting, he would like to take an assessment of everything that is remaining to do within the contract, including items that were completed to their satisfaction but not the Jurors. He listed a few of the streets and stated that the funding was not released nor has it been invoiced for any of these projects therefore, he will prepare an engineer's estimate of what he believes it would cost to complete all of this work with a 3<sup>rd</sup> party contractor. He will then do an assessment of the amount of funds being withheld along with how much has not been allocated from the budget for items such as shoulder work, etc. He also stated that any work that was done that was deficient would be documented. He stated that it will take him some time to go through all the numbers and make a recommendation that coincides with the legal department and closing out the contract with Coastal Bridge and moving forward with a 3<sup>rd</sup> party contractor, a bonding company, etc. and making sure the funds are available. Following a brief discussion, committee member Jeff Naquin stated that there are road failures already and requested that the Parish Engineer put the list together and get it to the Jury for review asap. In response, the Parish Engineer stated that with the recommendation, any work that was done that is deficient the funds are being held and he 's not recommending that we pay them and cut them loose. He then stated that there were weather issues that slowed them up but we are beyond that point so as the Engineer overseeing this project, the suggestion to withhold funds was made because it is obvious that they are not returning. In response, committee member Jeff Naquin asked the ADA if the numbers are too high and there's not enough funds to cover the cost for another contractor to complete the project, how can the Jury proceed. In response, the ADA stated that if they are solvent that's when the bonding company gets involved. He then stated that the Parish would need a formal recommendation from the Parish Engineer and devise a strategy on how to approach it legally. He then stated that the Parish is put in a more favorable position when having to get a third-party contractor in to complete the program. A brief discussion was then held regarding the need for the numbers for the remaining work to be presented ASAP. In response the Parish Engineer stated that he needs a directive from the Parish to move forward.
3. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the Parish Engineer to move forward with composing a list of in-completed projects, the total cost for completion for the Jury's review and a formal written recommendation that would allow the ADA to instruct the Jury on how to strategize." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Chairman Ron Alcorn recognized the committee member Jeff Naquin, who stated that LA 645 was re-done and turned over to the Parish. He stated that it is St. Rose Plantation and the residents have requested St. Rose Rd. be the new name. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to call a public hearing at the next meeting.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the committee approve holding a public hearing at the next meeting to rename LA 645 to St. Rose Rd." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Road & Bridge Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Jeff Naquin.  
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Grants Coordinator, who stated that a listing of the recipients for the LGAP Funding was sent to each Juror. She stated that Assumption Parish is eligible for \$165,700 of which \$25,000 is allocated to the Village of Napoleonville leaving a balance of \$140,700. She stated that LGAP is a line item allocation and the eligibility criteria is a fairly simple process. She stated that she has spoken with several Jurors regarding potential projects but she also has a potential project. She's not sure if it's a General Fund issue or not but she will be requesting funding to see that the needs of the center are met. She added that the deadline is December 16, 2019 to submit the application. She then opened the discussion for projects and stated that a decision is not needed tonight but hopefully by the next meeting she would like potential ideas with numbers. She proceeded to say that the Community Center is 7 yrs old and is on contracted event 740+ and needs some make up, renovations, aesthetics, etc. She further stated that an estimated amount for the request would be \$30,000-\$40,000. A brief discussion was held regarding the rent funds and the millage that is received for the center. In response, Chairman Irving Comeaux suggested that any project that would be funded under General Fund should be considered under this LGAP Funding. He stated that the morgue for the hospital (\$25,000) is the No. 1 priority. In response to any equipment needed, the Parish Manager stated that the pay loader is 14 yrs old and worn down and also an excavator. The Grants Coordinator requested that the projects with estimated cost be submitted to her before noon on next Friday the 18<sup>th</sup>. Police Juror Chris Carter stated that he is re-doing Grant Park and is falling short for the bleachers therefore, if there are any remaining funds, he would like this project to be considered.  
The Grant Coordinator announced that she applied for the Entergy Grant as authorized by the Jury and it's looking good. She stated that it's \$25,000 and it would be used to convert to LED lighting which will give a return on the electric bill. A brief discussion was held regarding the fees, rentals, solar panels, etc. of the Community Center.
3. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Sp. Assistant to the OHSEP Director, who stated that they received the construction plans for the RV Park at 5649 Hwy 308 and everything is in order. She recommended approval.
4. Committee member Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and grant construction approval for the RV Park at 5649 Hwy 308, Plattenville." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury Vice-President Jeff Naquin in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chambers located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were; Mr. Ron Alcorn, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Chris Carter, Ward 6; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.  
Police Jurors recorded as absent were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5.
3. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized the Police Juror Patrick Johnson to lead the Prayer and Police Juror Chris Carter led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of September 25, 2019." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Vice President Jeff Naquin opened the meeting for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the items listed on the agenda. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
6. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized Drainage Committee Vice-Chairman Chris Carter, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: \$200 for Bayou St. Vincent Debris Removal Project, \$4,762 for 154-158 Ewell St. Culvert Installation Project and \$804 for Northwest Side of LA 70 Drainage District Levee Repair Project.
7. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized Finance Committee Acting Chairman Ron Alcorn, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: List of Bills submitted through October 4, 2019, accepted the updated renewal contract with Script Care for the Detention Center and discussed the proposed budgets reduction and changes for the upcoming 2020 budget.
9. Police Juror Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
10. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that there was discussion of the Veterans Office and the rent that's paid for the use of the office building. She then stated that the Parish is now responsible for the repairs however, does the Police Jury want the repair cost to be deducted from the rent fee. Following a brief discussion, the Police Jury agreed to authorize the Secretary-Treasurer to meet with the Mayor and discuss the proposal.
11. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized Road & Bridge Committee Chairman Ron Alcorn, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following: received an update from the Parish Engineer relative to the Road Overly Program, authorize the Parish Engineer to move forward with composing a list of in-completed projects, the total cost for completion for the Jury's review and a formal recommendation that would allow the ADA to instruct the Jury on how to strategize and called for a public hearing at the next meeting to rename LA 645 to St. Rose Rd.
12. Police Juror Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Road & Bridge Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
13. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: discussed the 2019-2020 LGAP Funding Program and requested that projects be submitted at the next meeting and granted construction approval for a RV Park at 5649 Hwy 308, Plattenville.
14. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
15. Vice-President Jeff Naquin stated that a Public Hearing was held to received comments, questions or concerns regarding the proposed major subdivision at 201 Michel Rd. in the Pierre

Part community. He stated that Shane Guin, Engineer of High Tide Consulting, answered questions that related to the development.

16. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve the proposed major subdivision at 201 Michel Rd.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
17. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the construction phase of the proposed major subdivision at 201 Michel Rd." The motion was unanimously adopted.
18. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized Ben Malbrough, Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District, who presented the Jury with a copy of the site plan for the Water Control Structure at St. Thomas Bridge and what the structure entails. He informed the committee that on the north side of the Hwy 1010 bridge they are installing an emergency closed water control structure. He proceeded to explain how it will be constructed and its purpose. He also stated that the beneficiaries of this project are Assumption Parish residents, Assumption Waterworks, Ascension Parish residents and the water district. He stated that anytime there is an equipment malfunction for an extended period of time the water service elevation of the bayou artificially lowers. He stated that the benefits are two-fold, it protects the drinking water source and it allows them to maintain a more steady water surface elevation on the north side. In response, he stated that the CIAP funds was used to do a channel dredging from Belle Rose to the pedestrian bridge in Assumption and a water control structure in Lockport. He explained that the original intent of the structure was to prevent salt water intrusion. Mr. Malbrough stated that they issued the notice to proceed to Sea Level Construction last week and they will be mobilizing to the site in November. He further stated that it will be a 180-day construction project. He stated that they are anticipating completion by the end of March beginning of April. He then stated that upon completion of this structure at St. Thomas Bridge, they are looking at taking the weir out in Thibodaux. He stated that it can't be done immediately because it's elevation is not where it should be to protect the Parish water source but it does hold back some water. He then stated that they were successful at getting a substantial funding commitment from DEQ's Clean Water Revolving Loan Fund to build their pump station in Donaldsonville. He stated that they are borrowing \$65,000,000 from DEQ, CPRA is providing \$50,000,000 towards the loan and the Freshwater District will pay \$15,000,000 over a 15 yr. time span. He then stated that once the construction of the Water Control Structure at St Thomas Bridge is completed and the weir is out, a boat can go from the Napoleonville to Port Fourchon. In response to the status of the project behind the Media Center, Mr. Malbrough stated that the grant has been applied for but no word has been received. A brief discussion was then held regarding the project and its possibility.
19. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adoption of a resolution authorizing the filing of an application with the LADOTD for a grant under the Formula Grant for Rural Areas and Grants for Bus and Bus Facility Programs managed through LADOTD (Council on Aging)." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
20. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and authorize the President to sign the following for the Council on Aging Program: 2020-2021 Sections 5310, 5311 and 5316 Application, Certification and Assurances for applicant and Labor warranty for application to Small Urban and Rural Programs." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
21. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a liquor license application for Samantha Blanchard and Fallon Lightfoot." The motion was unanimously adopted.
22. Vice-President Jeff Naquin recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that she met with Danos, who has terminated their FTZ agreement for the Amelia area. She stated that they said they had no opportunities and it was not beneficial for them to maintain the lease. She then announced that Justin Clement successfully passed his Mosquito Control testing. He is now a certified Mosquito Control Supervisor.
